Media & the World Around Us

Are you interested in culture, the media, and how technology is shaping the world around us?

This interdisciplinary course explores the dynamic interplay between culture, the media, and the contemporary global landscape through a local and global perspective lens. Students will critically analyse how cultural identities are constructed, maintained, and challenged in a globalised world, with a particular emphasis on media influences and instigating societal change.

This course is open to Year 9 students at Seaton High School as an Entrepreneurial Endeavour elective subject, with study focus topics being shaped by student interest.

Students will explore the influence of digital media platforms and global connectivity on interconnected cultures, discuss ethical considerations in media representation, investigate how cultures define themselves and are represented in media and literature and analyse the impact of globalisation on cultural identity.

By the completion of the course, students will have developed an understanding of the complexities surrounding culture, the media, the instigation of societal change and the influence of technology on a global scale, enabling them to engage thoughtfully with contemporary issues in both English and Humanities disciplines.
